



Awareness Ribbons

Please note this pattern is written using **UK crochet terminology**. A US crochet version is also available on naztazia.com

Materials:

32 m / 35 yds yarn in pink, preferably a medium weight such as Double Knitting (DK), 10 ply or worsted. An additional 12 m / 13 yds yarn in white for contrasting edging.

Crochet hook, size 4.00 mm

Six stitch markers (paper clips, yarn scraps, safety pins)

Yarn needle and scissors

Optional hot glue gun if attaching magnets or pins to the back of ribbons.

Size/Tension:

Tension is not necessarily important; however, finished sample ribbon is: 14 cm/5.5 in (height) by 11 cm/4.25 in (width). This size can be modified by using a thinner or thicker yarn and/or a smaller or larger crochet hook.

Terminology:

CH = Chain

SLST = Slip stitch

DC = Double Crochet (UK Crochet Term)

Instructions:

With pink yarn, slipknot. CH 36. While chaining, place 1 stitch marker in CH #7 and CH #29.

Row 1: 1 DC in second CH from hook, then 1 DC in each of the next 34 CH. CH 1, turn work.

Row 2: Miss first CH. Work 3 sections:

Section 1: 1 DC in next 12 stitches, placing marker in DC #7 and DC #10.

Section 2: 2 DC in next 11 stitches.

Section 3: 1 DC in next 12 stitches, placing marker in DC #3 and DC #6.

Edging: Switch to white yarn. CH 1, turn work. 1 DC in next 6 stitches. Cross ribbon. Match up markers; 1 DC through both marked stitches. 1 DC in next 5 stitches. 3 DC in corner. Pivot work. 3 DC in adjacent corner. 1 DC in next 5 stitches. Match up stitch markers and 1 DC. 1 DC in each stitch around, stopping before next marker. Match up marked stitches, 1 DC. 1 DC in next 5 stitches. 3 DC in next corner. Pivot, 2 DC in remaining corner. SLST to first stitch. Fasten off; weave in ends. Glue optional magnet or pin to the back.
