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Granny Square Slippers (Crochet)

with YouTube Help Video

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Here's an easy way to make bedroom slippers or booties for adults – using 6 granny squares per shoe. Materials:

400 yards total worsted weight yarn. Sample used 1 skein Big Twists yarn in pink and small amounts in green and white.

Size F (3.75 mm) crochet hook. Sewing needle (weaving in ends). Scissors. Puff paint for bottom of soles for traction.

Size

1 granny square. Size Large 4"/sq. Medium 3.5"/sq. Small 3.25"/sq.

Terminology:

CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	HDC = Half Double Crochet	RND = Round
RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet	SLST = Slip Stitch	SP = Space
ST = Stitch

Make 12 squares.

With white, make a magic ring.

RND 1: CH 3. 2 DC. CH 1. RPT (3 DC, CH 1) 3 times. Pull hole closed. SLST to CH 3. Cut/weave ends.

RND 2: With green, connect to CH-1 SP. In SP, (CH 3, 2 DC, CH 1, 3 DC). RPT (3 DC, CH 1, 3 DC) in each CH-1 SP. SLST to CH 3. Cut/weave ends.

RND 3: With pink, connect to corner CH-1 SP. In corner SP, (CH 3, 2 DC, CH 1, 3 DC). 3 DC in next (middle) SP. RPT (3 DC, CH 1, 3 DC in corner SP; 3 DC in next SP) 3 times. SLST to CH 3. CONT to RND 4 with pink.

RND 4:

(Small): CH 1. SC in same SP. SC in each ST around, except for corner SPs, where you will make 3 SC. SLST to CH 1. Cut/weave ends.

(Medium): CH 2 (counts as 1 HDC). HDC in each ST around, except for corner SPs, where you will make 3 HDC. SLST to CH 2. Cut/weave ends.

(Large): CH 3 (counts as 1 DC). DC in each ST around, except for corners where you will make 3 DC. SLST to CH 3. Cut/weave ends.

Block squares if desired. Each slipper will use 6 squares. Sew 4 granny squares together. Flip over, place like a diamond shape, place 1 square on top, and 1 on the bottom, both right side up. Fold both sides up half way. Sew top square along 2 top edges to original granny squares, then sew along 2 bottom edges, connecting the 2 folded squares. Sew along bottom square's 2 bottom edges to the original granny squares, then sew (about) 5 stitches to the folded side squares. If desired, make a reverse single crochet border along the slipper's opening for decoration. Repeat for the other slipper. Use dots of puff paint on bottom of slippers, and let dry, for added traction.

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
