



Chilly Day Hooded Scarf (Crochet)

with YouTube Help Video

Materials:

650 yards total worsted weight yarn. Sample used 3 skeins Bernat Pop in Blue Blaze
Size I (5.5 mm) crochet hook. Sewing needle (weaving in ends). Scissors.

Size/Gauge

Scarf = 70" W x 6" (scarf) / 16" H (hood + scarf). Gauge 16 STS & 13 rows = 4" SQ

Terminology:

CH = Chain	RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet	SK = Skip/Miss
SP = Chain Space	ST = Stitch

SCARF:

CH 24 (or any multiple of 2).

ROW 1: SC in 2nd CH from hook. RPT [CH 1, SK CH, SC in next CH] across. CH 1.

Turn.

ROW 2: SC in 1st ST. SC in SP. RPT [CH 1, SC in next SP] across. SC in last ST. CH 1.

Turn.

ROW 3: SC in 1st ST. RPT [CH 1, SC in next SP] across. CH 1, SC in last ST. CH 1. Turn.

ROW 4: RPT Row 2.

RPT ROWs 3 & 4 for a total of 228 rows, or until scarf is 70 in/178 cm, or whatever measurement you prefer. Cut, weave in ends.

HOOD:

Fold scarf in half. Starting at fold, measure outward 12 inches and mark both top sides with a stitch marker. Open scarf (measurement between stitch markers should be 24 inches).

ROW 1: Place slipknot on hook. Working stitches along the one side of scarf, at the edge of rows, SC at first marker. RPT [CH 1, SK row, SC in next row] across, stopping with a SC at second stitch marker. CH 1. Turn.

ROW 2: RPT ROW 2 of SCARF.

ROW 3: RPT ROW 3 of SCARF.

ROW 4: RPT ROW 4 of SCARF.

RPT ROWs 3 & 4 for a total of 33 rows, or until hood is 10 in/25.4 cm high, or whatever measurement you prefer.

FINISH:

Cut a tail end 36" long for sewing, yarn over, pull hook through loop to secure last stitch. Thread a yarn needle. Fold down both top edges of the hood section into a triangle shape. Starting at the bottom of the triangle, sew the two edges together upwards towards the peak. Cut and weave in all ends.

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
