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Crocheting around eggs is both fun and pretty. This lace pattern can easily fit a jumbo-sized chicken egg as well as smaller duck or goose eggs. ## Materials:

Less than 20 yards of Red Heart or Aunt Lydia Crochet Thread - Size 10.

1.7 mm crochet hook. Scissors. Sewing needle. Hot glue gun.

1 jumbo chicken egg. <u>http://youtube.com/lorriepopow</u> shows how to empty contents of an egg. **Size/Gauge** 

Sample egg: 6.25" circumference (widest part). 3" height.

## Terminology:

CH = Chain	HDC = Half Double Crochet	RND = Round	RPT = Repeat
SC = Single Crochet	SLST = Slip Stitch	ST = Stitch	TR = Treble Crochet

## Instructions:

## Medallion (make 2):

Slipknot. CH 6. SLST to form ring.

**RND 1:** CH 1. 12 SC in ring. SLST to finish.

**RND 2:** CH 8 (counts as 1 TR + CH 3). In next ST [1 TR, CH 3] around. SLST to 5<sup>th</sup> CH.

RND 3: CH 1. In each SP [2 SC, CH 4, 2 SC] around. Cut and weave in ends.

**<u>Cord</u>:** CH 2. HDC in 2<sup>nd</sup> CH from hook. Turn. HDC in corner loop. RPT [Turn. HDC in 2 corner loops] until cord's length fits around egg height-wise.

<u>Assemble</u>: Glue cording in 4 places around egg (top, middle, bottom, middle, back to top). Glue center of medallions in center of egg (front & back). Use 18" strand of crochet thread and sew (lace-up) the medallions to the cording, using the CH-4 spaces to connect to cording.
