Easy Yarn Hair Wig

No Knitting or Crocheting Required!

Quick and Cute!

Materials:

- 250-350 yards of worsted weight yarn for each wig. The sample wigs were made with 1 skein of Impeccable Yarn in white and 1 skein in red from Michaels Craft Stores. Please note: head sizes vary, so you may need more or less yarn.
- Plain knit or crochet hat, either hand-made or store-bought. The sample wigs used 1 red and 1 white mesh knit hats purchased at Walmart. It's important to choose a hat that has some tiny "holes" in it. You will be pushing a hook through the hat and pulling through yarn. Please see the video for an example hat.
- 1 crochet hook or 1 Rainbow Loom hook. If you are using a crochet hook, you can easily use either a size F (3.75mm), a size G (4.25mm) or a size H (5mm)
- Scissors
- Hair brush
- Hot glue gun with glue (both low-and hi-temp work fine) (optional)
- Foam or glass head to work on. Or a balloon, vase, upside down bowl all work well. (optional)

White Wig:

Step #1: Try on the hat. Roll up the brim to fit your head. Place hat on the object you will be working on if desired (foam or glass head, or balloon, upside down bowl, vase, etc.)

Step #2: With scissors, cut 144 strands of yarn, each 75 inches long. You may need to make these strands longer or shorter, depending upon your head size.

Step #3: Take 4 strands of yarn, and fold them in half. Insert your hook into the edge of the brim of the hat in the middle of the forehead section, and pull the loop through partially. Use your fingers to insert the yarn ends through the loop. Pull tightly to secure the knot.

Step #4: Continue tying these knots, spaced evenly, around the left side and the right side edging of the brim. Leave approximately 4-8 inches in the back of the hat unworked. I made about 36 knots around for my white wig, leaving about 6 inches in the back of the hat with no knots.

Step #5: Starting at the middle of the forehead, take each knotted strand and bring it up and over the top of the hat. Continue doing this neatly for the top section of the wig. Hot glue here and there as needed to hold yarn in place.

Step #6: Turn your work on its side, and bring up the side strands. Hot glue as needed. Repeat on other side.

Step #7: Brush the hair very lightly as needed to smooth out the yarn.

Step #8: Begin braiding the hair. I chose a French braid for my wig; however you can use a regular braid or just a pony tail. At the end, tie and knot the ends with a scrap piece of yarn (or hair elastics) to keep the braid from unravelling.

Step #9: Add some wispy bangs by cutting 20 (or more) strands of 24-inch sections of yarn. Use 4 strands held together and add them slightly underneath the brim of the hat, then brought up towards the top of the hat. Hot glue yarn strands in place as needed.

Red Wig:

Step #1: Try on the hat. Roll up the brim to fit your head. Place hat on the object you will be working on if desired (foam or glass head, or balloon, upside down bowl, vase, etc.)

Step #2: With scissors, cut 100 strands of yarn, each 60 inches long. You may need to make these strands longer or shorter, depending upon your head size.

Step #3: Take 4 strands of yarn, and fold them in half. Insert your hook into top middle section of the top of the hat and pull the loop through partially. Use your fingers to insert the yarn ends through the loop. Pull tightly to secure the knot. Separate the strands, and place ½ on the left side and ½ on the right side to create a part down the middle of the wig. Add a streak of white on one side if desired.

Step #4: Continue tying these knots, spaced evenly, moving vertically, and starting at the center of the forehead all the way to the center of the back of the hat.

Step #5: Verify you have evenly separated each knot on both sides. Brush, smooth the yarn out, then hot glue here and there as needed to hold yarn in place.

Step #6: Cut approximately 20 strands of 12-inch strips. Fold 4 strands in half, and insert hook an inch or two down from the original knot to begin creating bangs. Continue adding a few more knots as desired horizontally. Cut bangs across forehead area once completed. Add hot glue as needed to hold in place.

Step #7: Begin braiding hair using the traditional braid method on one side, then repeat for the other side. At the end, tie and knot the ends with a scrap piece of yarn (or hair elastics) to keep the braids from unravelling.
