

FREE PATTERN & VIDEO



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**Materials:**

- 1 skein worsted weight yarn (less than 150 yards). Optional 10-20 yards bulky weight yarn for contrasting flower.
- Size I (5.5mm) crochet hook. Use a J (6mm) or K (6.5mm) if you crochet tightly.
- Optional 2-3 buttons, pin or other decorative accessory, plus needle for sewing on buttons and weaving in ends.
- Scissors

**Terms:**

- CH = Chain
- HDC = Half Double Crochet
- SLST = Slip Stitch
- HDC2TOG = Half Double Crochet Two Together.

# Easy Crochet Head Band Wrap with Flower

*Pretty for the colder season!*

**Headband/Headwrap:**

Make a slip knot and chain 5. Join with slip stitch to first chain (this ring will be used for the button hole).

Row 1: Chain 1, then do 3 half double crochet (HDC) stitches in this ring. Total = 3 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 2: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 3 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 3: Do 1 HDC in the first stitch, then 3 HDCs in the next stitch, then 1 HDC in the last stitch. Total = 5 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 4: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 5 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 5: Do 1 HDC in each of the first 2 stitches, then 3 HDCs in the next stitch, followed by 1 HDC in each of the next 2 stitches. Total = 7 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 6: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 7 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 7: Do 1 HDC in each of the first 3 stitches, then 3 HDCs in the next stitch, followed by 1 HDC in each of the next 3 stitches. Total = 9 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 8: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 9 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 9: Do 1 HDC in each of the first 4 stitches, then 3 HDCs in the next stitch, followed by 1 HDC in each of the next 4 stitches. Total = 11 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 10: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 11 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Alterations: At this point, the wrap should be wide enough for you. If it is not, continue on in pattern. The next row would be 5, 3, 5... and the row after that would be 6, 3, 6.

Rows 11+: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Chain 1 and turn your work. Total = 11 HDC (or more if you made alterations). Continue doing these straight HDC rows until the wrap fits your head. Mine required 22 rows of straight HDCs. Take into consideration there will be an additional 8 rows of decrease tapering.

Decreasing rows: (note if you altered the pattern to increase the width, take into consideration the additional numbers when decreasing)

Row 1: Do 1 HDC in each of the first 4 stitches (or 5 or 6 if you altered the pattern), then over the next 3 stitches, do a HDC2TOG, skipping a space in between. How to do this (check out my YouTube video): yarn over, insert hook into the first of 3 stitches, yarn over, draw up a loop, yarn over, skip a stitch, insert hook into 3<sup>rd</sup> stitch, yarn over, draw up a loop, yarn over and pull through all loops on hook. Then do 1 HDC in each of the next 4 stitches (or 5 or 6 if you altered the pattern). Total = 9 stitches (remember this total will be different if you altered the pattern). Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 2: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 9 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 3: Do 1 HDC in each of the first 3 stitches, then over the next 3 stitches, do a HDC2TOG, skipping a space in between. Do 1 HDC in each of the next 3 stitches. Total = 7 stitches. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 4: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 7 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 5: Do 1 HDC in each of the first 2 stitches, then over the next 3 stitches, do a HDC2TOG, skipping a space in between. Do 1 HDC in each of the next 2 stitches. Total = 5 stitches. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 6: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 5 HDC. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 7: Do 1 HDC in the first stitch, then over the next 3 stitches, do a HDC2TOG, skipping a space in between. Do 1 HDC in the last stitch. Total = 3 stitches. Chain 1 and turn your work.

Row 8: Do 1 HDC in each stitch. Total = 3 HDC. Cut yarn, pull loop through to secure it, and weave in ends.

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### Flower:

Step 1: Make a slip knot and chain 4. Join with slip stitch to first chain.

Step 2: Chain 5, slip stitch into the ring. Repeat this process of Chain 5, and slip stitching into the ring 4 more times. Total = 5 loops.

Step 3: Bend the flower forward, then slip stitch in the middle of the first loop. See my YouTube video for help with this.

Step 4: Chain 7. Slip stitch in the middle of the second loop.

Step 5: Chain 7. Slip stitch in the middle of the third loop.

Step 6: Chain 7. Slip stitch in the middle of the fourth loop.

Step 7: Chain 7. Slip stitch in the middle of the fifth loop.

Step 8: Chain 7. Slip stitch in the slip stitch of the first loop.

Cut your yarn, pull your loop through, weave in ends.

Thread yarn through a button with your needle. Insert the both ends of the yarn through the flower, then through the head wrap. Tie a knot tightly on the opposite side. Cut and weave in your ends. Enjoy!

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- Optional 2-3 buttons, pin or other decorative accessory, plus needle for sewing on buttons and weaving in ends.

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
