

Easy Weave/Woven Infinity Scarf Cowl or Traditional Weaved Crochet Scarf

Pretty for the colder season!

Traditional or Infinity Scarf (both are started the same way):

Make a slip knot and chain 15. You may alter the number of chains to make a wider or less-wide scarf. Be sure to chain an "odd" number of chains. Afterwards, chain an additional 5 chains.

Row 1: Skip the first 5 chains and double crochet in the 6th chain from the hook. Chain 1. Skip a chain, and do 1 double crochet in the next chain. Chain 1, do 1 double crochet in the next chain. Repeat this [Chain 1, do 1 double crochet in the next chain] across the row. At the end, chain 4 and turn your work.

Row 2: Skip the chain space, and do 1 double crochet in the next double crochet. Chain 1. Skip the chain space and do 1 double crochet in the next double crochet. Repeat this [Chain 1, skip the chain space, do 1 double crochet in the next double crochet] across the row. I suggest that at the last double crochet, insert your hook in the 3rd chain of the 5 chains done at the beginning of previous row to make your double crochet. At the end, chain 4 and turn your work.

Row 3: Skip the chain space, and do 1 double crochet in the next double crochet. Repeat [Chain 1, skip the chain space, do 1 double crochet in the next double crochet] across the row. At the last double crochet, insert your hook in the 2nd chain of the 4 chains done at the beginning of previous row to make your double crochet. At the end, chain 4 and turn your work.

Rows 4-100: Repeat Row 3. You may make more or less than the suggested 100 rows for your scarf.

For the traditional scarf:

Once you are satisfied with the length of your scarf, cut and weave in the ends.

For the infinity scarf:

Do not cut your yarn. Chain 1. Take both ends of the scarf and place them wrong side to wrong side. Slip stitch the ends together – or sew them together (your choice). This will form the long infinity loop. Once the ends are stitched together, cut and weave in the ends.

Materials:

- 250-300 yards worsted weight yarn used in the scarf shown. You can use any weight yarn.
- 20-25 yards ribbon or novelty yarn or 50-75 yards worsted weight yarn for weaving
- Size H (5mm) crochet hook or equivalent hook for your size of yarn.
- Scissors, needle for weaving in ends

Terms:

- CH = Chain
- DC = Double Crochet
- SLST = Slip Stitch
- SK = Skip

American English Crochet Terms

For both scarves:

Choose a weaving material – you can use ribbon, novelty yarn like pompom yarn, several strands of yarn, or (as in my examples) chains. Whatever you choose, ensure they are slightly larger than the length of your scarf, so that you are not short (you can always trim excess off at the end). Weave over and under the bars of the scarf (going in length-wise direction). You can alternate rows – over/under verses under/over.

Traditional scarf:

You can weave in your tail ends – or you can add fringe or tassels at both ends of the scarf to help blend in and conceal your tail ends.

Infinity scarf:

Tie and knot your two ends of your weaving material at the back (where you joined the two ends of the scarf together). Cut and weave in excess ends.
