



Chromatic Phone Case (Crochet)

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Here's a fun way to crochet the chromatic phone case for your cell. Take two solid granny squares. Then turn them so they form two diamonds. Sew them together and voila! Nice pouch for yourself. Of course, they also make great gifts for friends, teachers, and anyone who happens to have a mobile device. Terminology:

CH = Chain	RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet
SLST = Slip Stitch	SP = Space	ST = Stitch

Size/Gauge:

Size: Sample case is 3" x 6.5". Pattern is easily customizable for most phones. Each square is 5" SQ. Gauge: 12 STs and Rows = 2" SQ.

Materials:

About 150 yards of (DK weight yarn). Sample used Hobby Lobby Yarn Bee Sugarwheel Cotton. Size F 3.75 mm crochet hook. Yarn needle, scissors. One 3/4" button.

Instructions:

Note: Cut the yarn into sections by color and change colors every two rounds. (Orange, Yellow, Light Green, Medium Green, Blue, Hot Pink, Purple). Or, let the yarn create the color changes naturally.

GRANNY SQUARE (Make 2)

Make a Magic ring. Work in rounds.

RND 1: CH 1. Make 4 SC in ring. Pull end to close. SLST to first SC. CH 1. (Total = 4 SC)
RND 2: Make 3 SC in same SP as SLST, and 3 SC in each ST around. SLST to first SC. CH 1.
(Total = 12 SC)
RND 3: RPT [In next ST (middle of previous 3 SC), make 3 SC. SC in each of the next 2 STs] around. SLST to first SC. CH 1.
RND 4: RPT [In next ST, make 3 SC. SC in each of the next 4 STs] around. SLST to first SC. CH 1.
RND 5: RPT [In next ST, make 3 SC. SC in each of the next 6 STs] around. SLST to first SC. CH 1.
RNDs 6-14: Continue in pattern, increasing by 2 SCs as needed for the sides.

MEASURE

Stop and measure cell phone. Rotate the first granny square to form a diamond. Wrap the 2 sides around the cell phone. The two points should easily touch on the other side. If the points overlap, slowly remove rounds until they meet. If the points do not yet meet, continue in pattern beyond RND 14 until they do. Be sure to make the same number of rounds on the second square.

On the second square, after finishing the last round with a SLST, SLST to the nearest corner. CH 10 for the button loop and SLST to corner. Measure loop to ensure button can fit inside of it. Fasten off. Cut and weave in all ends.

SEWING

Place the first square (without the loop), right side up, on the front of the phone. Wrap the sides and base to the back side. Sew seams. Place the second square (with the loop), wrong side up, on the back of the phone. Ensure the button loop is at the top. Wrap the sides and top to the front. Sew the sides and back together. Sew a button on the front.
