



Chain Loop Border Edging (Crochet)

with YouTube Help Video

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Here's a fun, simple, and easy crochet chain loop border edging. This works great on a scarf, blanket, shawl, and more. The basic stitches of crochet are used, so this is a great beginner crochet border edging. Terminology:

CH = Chain

SC = Single Crochet

RPT = Repeat

ST = Stitch

Instructions:

NOTES: You can easily use 2 or 3 colors. If you choose 4 or more, you might need to experiment with increasing the number of chains. For example, with 4 colors, you might want to chain 8 instead of 6. Keep all chain loops forward when working.

The stitch multiple is the number of colors you wish to use. With 3 colors, the stitch multiple is 3.

Setup:

With color A: CH 1. SC. CH 6. With color B, place slipknot on hook. SC in next ST. CH 6. With color C, place slipknot on hook. SC in next ST. CH 6.

ROW/RND 1: RPT [With color A, SC in next ST, CH 6. With color B, SC in next ST, CH 6. With color C, SC in next ST, CH 6.] across (for rows) or around (for rounds).

For the last 3 chain loops, fasten off after the CH 6. Bring each one over and to the back of the work. Use a yarn needle to make a few stitches in the back to secure. Weave in all ends.
