Terminology:		
CH = Chain	HDC = Half Double Crochet	DC = Double Crochet
RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet	SK = Skip/Miss
SLST = Slip Stitch	ST= Stitch	

Instructions:

Watch the YouTube tutorial video here: <u>https://youtube.com/naztazia</u> Look for "Crochet Tulip Border."

Use the same yarn or attach the border yarn to a corner with the front side facing up.

CH 3 (counts as a DC). CH 2. SK 2 STs. 1 DC. RPT [CH 2, SK 2, 1 DC] along the first side. In the first corner, CH 2, 1 DC in same ST as previous DC. Continue each side with [CH 2, SK 2, 1 DC] and corners with [CH 2, 1 DC in same ST as previous DC] around. After creating last DC, CH 2, and SLST to 3rd CH.

Create each tulip flower.

CH 3. SLST to next DC. CH 1, turn. In ring, make 1 SC, 1 HDC, 3 DC. Turn. Along previous row's adjacent DC - make 3 DC. Reach over and SLST in same ST as the first SLST. RPT the above instructions for each tulip flower. Treat corners the same way as above. At the end, fasten off and weave in ends.
