Here's a fun stitch called the crochet teardrop stitch. It's like a mini version of the larksfoot stitch. There are less holes than the traditional larksfoot stitch, plus the design pattern that forms is smaller in size. This stitch pattern works nicely for a scarf, baby blanket, afghan, shawl, bag, and more. 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CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	RPT = Repeat

CH 34 (multiple of 4+2)

ROW 1: 3 DC in 6th CH from hook. CH 1. RPT [SK 3 CHs, 3 DC in next CH, CH 1] across, ending with 2 DC in the last CH. CH 2, turn.

ROW 2: RPT [In the next CH-1 SP, DC, TR in middle of SK'd 3 CHs from ROW 1, DC, CH 1] across, ending with 2 DC on top of SK'd CHs. CH 2, turn.

ROW 3: RPT [In the CH-1 SP, DC, TR in SK'd middle ST from ROW below, DC, CH 1] across, ending with 2 DC on top of turning CHs. CH 2, turn.

ROWs 4+: RPT ROW 3.

LAST ROW: RPT [In the CH-1 SP, DC, TR in SK'd middle ST from ROW below, DC. Then SC in middle of the next 3-ST cluster instead of a CH-1] across, ending with 2 DC on top of turning CH. Cut yarn and fasten off.
