The crochet granny cluster stitch is a nice variation on the traditional granny stitch. It is comprised of a 3 double crochet cluster stitch, followed by a row of the moss stitch. This stitch pattern is pretty, adds a lovely texture, yet doesn't take up very much yarn. It's not a yarn eater like some cluster stitches! Terminology:

CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	RPT = Repeat
SC = Single Crochet	SK = Skip/Miss	ST= Stitch
YO = Yarn Over		

CL = Cluster. YO, insert hook into ST, draw up a loop. YO, draw through 2 loops. RPT [YO, insert hook into same ST, draw up loop, YO and draw through 2 loops] twice. YO, draw through 4 loops.

Instructions:

CH 30, or any even number.

ROW 1: SC in 2nd CH from hook and in next CH. RPT [CH 1, SK next CH, SC in next CH] until last 3 CHs. CH 1. SK next CH and SC in last 2 CHs. CH 4, turn.

ROW 2: RPT [SK next SC, CL in next CH-1 SP, CH 1] until last CH-1 SP. CL in last CH-1 SP, CH 1, SK next SC, DC in last SC. CH 1, turn.

ROW 3: SC in DC. SC in CH-1 SP. RPT [CH 1, SK next CL, SC in next CH-1 SP] until last repeat. SC in last SP, SC in 3rd CH. CH 4, turn.

RPT ROWs 2 & 3 for desired height.
