



Wavy Pad (Crochet)

with YouTube Help Video

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The Crochet Wavy Pad is a fun square to make using the wiggle or wiggly crochet technique. The crochet waves form a ruffle effect over a mesh base. It's a great way to make a dishcloth, washcloth, hot pad, trivet, potholder and more! Terminology:

CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	HDC = Half Double Crochet
RPT = Repeat	SLST = Slip Stitch	ST = Stitch

Size/Gauge:

8" W x 8" H. Gauge isn't important.

Materials:

150 yards total of 100% cotton yarn. Sample used small amounts of Sugar 'n Cream. Crochet hook Size F (3.75 mm) or Size G (4.00 mm). Scissors. Yarn needle.

Instructions:

With base color yarn, CH 44.

ROW 1: Skip 7 CHs, make 1 DC in next CH. RPT [CH 2, skip 2, DC in next CH] across. Total = 13 spaces. Turn.


ROW 2: CH 3 (counts as DC). RPT [CH 2, skip 2, DC in DC] across, placing last DC in 3rd CH.

RPT ROW 2 for a total of 13 ROWS. Fasten off and weave in ends.


Following the chart(s), work on the outer ruffle first. Place a slipknot on your hook and slip stitch to any designated bar on the chart. CH 2. Make 2 more HDC in that space. Following the chart, make 3 HDC along each bar. Once a full ruffle is completed in the round, fasten off and weave in ends.

Work on the next inner ruffle according to the instructions for the first outer ruffle.

It helps to note that the outer ruffle (RND 1) and all other odd ruffles (RND 3, RND 5) form a similar pattern in the corners. RNDs 2, 4, and 6 form a similar pattern in the corners. All side ruffles should line up in the same direction.
