



Bavarian Crochet Square (Crochet)

with YouTube Help Video

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Bavarian crochet is a neat stitch pattern and technique that you can use in many ways. Instead of a granny square, you can make a Bavarian crochet square as a component in a blanket, handbag, rug, and more. Terminology:

CH = Chain	RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet
SLST = Slip Stitch	SP = Space	ST= Stitch
TR = Treble Crochet	4-TR CL = 4 treble crochet cluster	

4-BPTR TOG = 4 back post treble crochet together

8-BPTR TOG = 8 back post treble crochet together

Materials:

Stitch patterns can use almost any yarn weight or type and corresponding hook size. However, if this is your first time, I would recommend a DK weight yarn - [3] on the label - and a size F 3.75 mm crochet hook (or a G 4 or 4.25 mm one).

Change colors every 2 rounds.

CH 4. SLST to first CH.

RND 1: CH 1. RPT in ring 4 times [SC, CH 5, 4-TR CL, CH 5]. SLST to SC.

RND 2: CH 1. SC in SC. RPT [On top of 4-TR CL (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR) SC in SC] 4 times, replacing last SC with a SLST to SC instead. Fasten off yarn.

RND 3: Using new yarn, SC in first CH-1 SP of any corner. RPT [CH 5, 4-BPTR TOG, CH 5, SC in CH-1 SP, CH 5, 8-BPTR TOG, CH 5, SC in CH-1 SP] around, replacing last SC with a SLST to SC instead.

RND 4: CH 1. SC in SC. RPT [On top of 4-BPTR TOG (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR) SC in SC; On top of 8-BPTR TOG (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR) SC in SC] around, replacing last SC with a SLST to SC instead. Fasten off yarn.

RND 5: Using new yarn, SC in first CH-1 SP of any corner. RPT [CH 5, 4-BPTR TOG, CH 5, SC in CH-1 SP, CH 5, 8-BPTR TOG, CH 5, SC in CH-1 SP, CH 5, 8-BPTR TOG, CH 5, SC in CH-1 SP] around, replacing last SC with a SLST to SC instead.

RND 6: CH 1. SC in SC. RPT [On top of 4-BPTR TOG (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR) SC in SC; On top of 8-BPTR TOG (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR) SC in SC; On top of 8-BPTR TOG (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR) SC in SC] around, replacing last SC with a SLST to SC instead. Fasten off yarn.

RND 7: Using new yarn, continue in pattern, noting the following hints: Use 4-BPTR TOG in each of the four corners, and the 8-BPTR TOG in each of the Vs.

RND 8: Continue in pattern, noting the following hints: On top of the four corners of 4-BPTR TOG, work (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR). On top of the Vs of 8-BPTR TOG, work the (4 TR, CH 1, 4 TR).

Continue in pattern for as many rounds as desired.
