Here is a cute flower pad for your kitchen, bath, or any room in the house. The flower is created with 6 hexagon motifs that are then joined along the top, and then the bottom section. These work up very quickly and are a great way to use up leftover yarn. ### Terminology:

CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	RPT = Repeat
SP = Space	ST= Stitch	
Size / Courses		

### Size/Gauge:

Finished item is 10" in diameter. Gauge 9 STs and 4 ROWs = 2" SQ

### **Materials:**

Total of 130 yards of worsted weight 100% cotton yarn. Sample used Sugar n Cream. Size F 3.75 crochet hook. Scissors. Yarn needle.

## Instructions:

Change colors every round (as in the sample), or every two rounds, or leave as a single color.

Make 6 hexagon motifs

## **HEXAGON MOTIF**

Make a magic ring (which is just a loose slipknot)

**RND 1**: CH 3 (counts as 1 DC throughout). 2 DC in ring. RPT [CH 2, 3 DC in ring] 5 times. At the end, CH 1 and SC to top of CH-3.

**RND 2**: CH 3 (counts as 1 DC in the previous CH-1/SC SP). 1 DC over next 3 DC. 1 DC in CH-2 SP. RPT [CH 2, DC in CH-2 SP, DC over next 3 DC, 1 DC in CH-2 SP] around, ending with CH 1 and SC to top of CH-3.

**RND 3**: CH 3. DC over next 5 DC. 1 DC in CH-2 SP. RPT [CH 2, DC in CH-2 SP, DC over next 5 DC, 1 DC in CH-2 SP] around, ending with CH 1 and SC to top of CH-3.

**RND 4**: CH 3. DC over next 7 DC. 1 DC in CH-2 SP. RPT [CH 2, DC in CH-2 SP, DC over next 7 DC, 1 DC in CH-2 SP] around, ending with CH 1 and SC to top of CH-3.

Fasten off, weave in all ends.

# JOIN TOP SECTION

Place a slipknot on your hook. Working with one motif, make a SC after a CH-2 SP. Continue making a SC along that side. When you reach the next CH-2 SP, make 2 SC in it. Continue along the next side with 1 SC in each ST. Make 1 SC in the next CH-2 SP. Working with the second motif, make a SC in any CH-2 SP. Continue making a SC along the side of this second motif. When you reach the next CH-2 SP, make 2 SC in it. Continue along the next side with 1 SC in each ST. Make 1 SC in the next CH-2 SP. Connect the third motif in the same manner, followed by the fourth, fifth, and sixth. After the last ST in the sixth motif, place the motifs, right sides up, in a circle. Make 1 SC in the CH-2 SP next to the first SC on the first motif. Fasten off and weave in ends.

## JOIN BOTTOM SECTION

Thread a yarn needle with 20" of yarn and double it. Along the bottom CH-2 SPs, weave this doubled yarn along the edge. See video for the tips and tricks for getting a smooth finish.

Adjust the motifs so the sides touching each other flare out into petal shapes. Fasten off and weave in all ends. You can press the petals down a bit with a medium iron.

<u>If you have any concerns</u> about the slight gaps in the center of the flower petals, turn the pad over to the back and whipstitch them closed with matching yarn and a yarn needle.
