



# Reverse Single Crochet Twisted Single Crochet Reverse Slip Stitch

The reverse single crochet edging is a smaller border for your crochet work. Also check out the twisted single crochet and reverse slip stitch. You can use any weight of yarn and any crochet hook size. There are no multiples in these stitches.

### Reverse Single Crochet

Place a slip knot on your hook. Insert hook into the opposite end of where you would normally crochet and make a single crochet. Make a single crochet in the next stitch, which is in the reverse direction of how you would normally work. Really draw up a loop when making the first part of the stitch. Continue across the row. Fasten off and weave in ends.

### Twisted Single Crochet

Place a slip knot on your hook and make a slip stitch to the first stitch. Chain 1. Insert hook into the next stitch and begin the single crochet stitch by drawing up a loop. Twist the crochet hook around. Yarn over and finish the single crochet. It is also important to really draw up a loop when making the first part of this stitch. Continue making these twisted single crochet stitches across the row. At the end, fasten off and weave in ends.

### **Reverse Slip Stitch**

This is made in a similar manner to the reverse single crochet. Place a slip knot on your hook. Insert hook into the opposite end of where you would normally crochet and make a slip stitch. Chain 1. Make a slip stitch in the next stitch, which is in the reverse direction of how you would normally work. Chain 1. Continue across the row with slip stitches with a chain 1 in between. Fasten off and weave in ends.
