



Ice Skates (Crochet)

Here are some cute ice skates that you can crochet. In the past, our family used to put these on the Christmas tree. Sometimes we would place a pin on the top of the bow part and wear it on our coat. These work up very quickly and are easy to make! Terminology:

CH = Chain

SC = Half Double Crochet

RPT = Repeat

SLST = Slip Stitch

ST= Stitch

Size/Gauge:

2.25" W x 2.75" L. 9 STs & 9 ROWs = 2" SQ

Materials:

Less than 20 yards DK weight yarn. Sample used Lion Brand Mandala. Two 2" paperclips. Yarn needle. Scissors. Optional pom-pom decoration.

Instructions:

MAKE 2:

Place a slipknot on hook. Position the top of the paperclip with the outside end facing upwards.

ROW 1: Make 2 SC in single loop area of the paperclip. Make 6 SC over the double wire area. Make 2 SC in the other end of the loop area. Total = 10 SC.

Switch to Rounds.

RND 2: CH 1. Make 1 SC in the front loops of the 10 SC from ROW 1. Pivot to work on the other side. Make 1 SC in the back loops of the same 10 SC from ROW 1. SLST to first ST. Total = 20 SC.

RND 3: CH 1. Make 1 SC around, using both loops again. SLST to first ST. Total = 20 SC.

RNDs 4-5: RPT RND 3.

RND 6: CH 1. Make 1 SC in the first 6 SC. Skip 8 SC. Make 1 SC in the last 6 SC. SLST to first ST. Total = 12 SC.

RND 7: CH 1. Make 1 SC around. SLST to first ST. Total = 12 SC.

RNDs 8-12: RPT RND 7. Feel free to change colors on the last RND if desired.

FINISH:

Fasten off and weave in ends. Sew top of boot closed if desired. Glue or sew on a pompom or embroider laces.

CHAIN:

CH 75. Fasten off and make a bow in the middle. Sew an end inside one of the skates. Sew the other end to the inside of the other skate.
