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Easy Triangle Scarf (Crochet)

This triangle scarf is easy and fast to make as well as drapes nicely. The delicate edging adds a bit of elegance. Terminology:		
CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	RPT = Repeat
SC = Single Crochet	SLST = Slip Stitch	ST= Stitch

Size/Gauge:

60" W x 30" H unstretched, without edging.

Materials:

275 yds DK weight yarn. Sample used K+C Smooth in Green Lt. Size G 4 mm crochet hook. Scissors, yarn needle. Measuring tape.

Instructions:

NOTE: SCs will be worked in the BLO (back loop only) of designated stitch. DC will be worked directly in the CH-loop from the previous row.

<u>Scarf</u>

ROW 1: CH 7. SLST to first CH. CH 7, turn. ROW 2: SC in 3rd CH of loop. CH 5. DC in CH-7 loop. CH 7, turn. ROW 3: SC in 3rd CH of loop. CH 5. SC in 3rd CH of next loop. CH 5. DC in last loop. CH 7, turn. ROW 4: SC in 3rd CH of loop. RPT [CH 5, SC in 3rd CH of next loop] 2 times. CH 5. DC in last loop. CH 7, turn. ROW 5: SC in 3rd CH of loop. RPT [CH 5, SC in 3rd CH of next loop] 3 times. CH 5. DC in last loop. CH 7, turn. ROW 6: SC in 3rd CH of loop. RPT [CH 5, SC in 3rd CH of next loop] 4 times. CH 5. DC in last loop. CH 7, turn.

Continue in this pattern for a total of 51 rows, increasing the bracketed [] instructions by 1 time for each row. Measure work. Width across the longest edge should be about 60 inches for an average scarf. Feel free to modify the number of rows to meet the sample's edge width, or, to make it larger/smaller. If adjusting the row number, ensure the total is an ODD number of rows once completed. Do not fasten off and continue to Edging section.

Edging

Work along the first shorter edge, then place an extra motif in the center bottom point, then work along second shorter edge. Once completed, fasten off and weave in ends.

Start with a SC inside the loop of last [CH-5, DC] made. RPT the following along the edges: CH 8. SLST in 3rd CH from hook. CH 3. SLST in 3rd CH from hook. CH 3. SLST in 3rd CH from hook. SLST in same CH of the very first SLST (which is the 6th CH of the original CH-8). CH 5. Skip 1 loop along the edging. SC in next loop.



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
