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## Kitchen Towel with Topper (Crochet)

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This kitchen towel with topper has a lovely texture. Worked from the bottom up, it is fast and easy to make. 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CH = Chain	DC = Double Crochet	RPT = Repeat	
SC = Single Crochet	SLST = Slip Stitch	ST= Stitch	
ALT-CH3 = SC in designated ST, then SC alongside of first SC.			

BPDC = Back Post Double Crochet FPDC = Front Post Double Crochet

## Size/Gauge:

15" H x 12" W (about 7" W while folded under and hanging from a handle). Gauge 4 ROWs 7 & 8 STs = 2"SQ.

## **Materials:**

180 yards worsted weight 100% cotton yarn. Sample used 1 skein (120 yds) Sugar n Cream in Jute and the remaining of red and green yarn. Size G 4 mm crochet hook. Scissors, yarn needle. One 1.25" button.

## **Instructions:**

With red yarn, CH 46.

ROW 1: Skip  $1^{st}$  CH. ALT-CH3 in  $2^{nd}$  CH from hook (counts as 1 DC). DC in remaining STs. Total = 45 STs. Turn.

ROW 2: ALT-CH3 in first ST. SC in next ST. RPT [DC in next ST, SC in next ST] across. DC in last ST. Total = 45 STs. Change to green yarn. Turn.

ROW 3: ALT-CH3 in first ST. DC in remaining STs. Total = 45 STs. Turn.

ROW 4: ALT-CH3 in first ST. SC in next ST. RPT [DC in next ST, SC in next ST] across. DC in last ST. Total = 45 STs. Change to beige yarn. Turn.

At this point it's a good idea to measure your work. Sample is 12" wide. 10" to 14" are still acceptable widths for a kitchen towel. However, those range of widths might take more or less yarn than listed in pattern.

ROW 5: ALT-CH3 in first ST. DC in remaining STs. Total = 45 STs. Turn.

ROW 6: ALT-CH3 in first ST. In next 2 STs, FPDC. RPT [In next 3 STs, BPDC. In next 3 STs, FPDC] across, until last 3 STs. In last 3 STs, FPDC in next 2 STs. DC on top of last ST. Turn.

**ROWs 7-22: RPT ROW 6.** 

ROW 23: Change to green yarn. ALT-CH3 in first ST. DC in remaining STs. Total = 45 STs. Turn.

ROW 24: ALT-CH3 in first ST. SC in next ST. RPT [DC in next ST, SC in next ST] across. Total = 45 STs. Change to red yarn. Turn.

ROW 25: ALT-CH 3, in first ST. DC in remaining STs. Turn.

ROW 26: ALT-CH3. RPT [Skip 1, DC in next ST] across, placing last DC in the top of the last ST. Turn.

ROW 27: ALT-CH3. DC in each ST across. Turn.

ROW 28: ALT-CH3. RPT [Skip 1, DC in next ST] across, placing last DC in the top of the last ST. Total = 12 STs. Turn.

ROWs 29-37: ALT-CH3. DC in each ST across. Turn.

ROW 38: ALT-CH3. DC in next 4 STs. CH 2, skip 2. DC in next 5 STs. Turn.

ROW 39: ALT-CH3. DC in next 4 STs. 2 DC in CH-2 space, DC in next 5 STs. Fasten off.

Sew button in place – sample placed button on ROW 29. Fasten off and weave in all ends.
