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Smock Stitch (Crochet)

This crochet smock stitch, sometimes also known as the honeycomb stitch, is a lovely textured stitch pattern. It works up fast and easy and looks nice in a blanket, scarf, shawl, and more. Terminology:

CH = Chain	RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet
ST= Stitch		

ESC = Extended single crochet made 2 rows below.

SC2TOG = Insert hook into second bar of first ESC and into first part of next ESC. Yarn over, pull through. Yarn over, pull through all loops.

CH 31 (odd #)

ROW 1: SC in 2nd CH from hook and in each ST across. CH 1, turn. Total = 30 STs (throughout)

ROW 2: SC in each ST across. CH 1, turn.

ROW 3: SC in same ST. ESC in next ST. [SC in next ST, ESC in next ST] across. CH 1, turn.

ROW 4: SC in first ST. [SC2TOG in next ST, SC in next ST]. SC in last ST. CH 1, turn.

ROW 5: ESC in first ST. SC in next ST. RPT [ESC in next ST, SC in next ST] across. CH 1, turn.

ROW 6: SC in first ST. SC in next ST. RPT [SC2TOG in next ST, SC in next ST] across. CH 1, turn.

RPT ROWs 3-6.
