**Terminology:**

CH = Chain	RPT = Repeat	SC = Single Crochet
ST = Stitch		

**Size/Gauge**

Size = 9" x 9". Gauge = 15 STs & 15 ROWs = 4" SQ.

**Materials**

About 100 worsted weight yarn (total) and an H 5 mm hook. This sample used blue and green yarn, with a small amount of yellow and white. For home décor, acrylic works nicely. For cleaning, 100% cotton is good. For handling warm items, 100% cotton or 100% natural wool works well.

MAIN DISHCLOTH

With blue yarn, CH 35.

ROW 1: Skip the first CH, and SC across.

ROWS 2-35: CH 1, turn. SC in each CH across.

Alternate the blue/green yarn every 7 rows. ROWs 1-7 = blue | ROWs 8-14 = green | ROWs 15-21 = blue | ROWs 22-28 = green | ROWs 29-35 = blue

Fasten off and weave in ends.

### SURFACE CROCHET

**HORIZONTAL CHAINS:** With yellow yarn, place a slipknot on your hook. Starting in between the color changes (e.g. ROW 7), surface crochet a chain across the ROW. Fasten off. Continue this process between each of the 5 color changes with different or the same yarn color. Yarn ends can be crocheted over at the end with the border/edging around the cloth.

**VERTICAL CHAINS:** With yellow yarn, place a slipknot on your hook. Count over 7 STs from one side. In that 7<sup>th</sup> ST, begin the vertical surface crochet, following the stitches upwards from ROW 1 through ROW 35. Fasten off. Continue this process, counting over 7 STs from the last CH made and beginning the new surface crochet in the 7<sup>th</sup> ST.

### BORDER

With white yarn, place a single crochet border around all four edges, crocheting over any tail ends from the surface crochet. Fasten off and weave in ends.
