Terminology:		
CH = Chain	ESC = Extended Single Crochet	RPT = Repeat
SC = Single Crochet	SP = Space	ST= Stitch
Instructions:		

With pink yarn, CH 22 (multiple of 10+2)

FOUNDATION ROW: SC in 2nd CH from hook. SC in each CH across. CH 1, turn.

Make 5 ROWs of SC STs. Fasten off pink yarn after last ROW and turn work.

EXTENDED ROW: Place a slipknot on hook with blue yarn. Insert hook into first pink ST and SC. In second ST, ESC one ROW below. In third ST, ESC two ROWs below. In fourth ST, ESC three ROWs below. In fifth ST, ESC four ROWs below. In sixth ST, ESC five ROWs below. This is the bottom of the triangular point. Work upwards in a stepwise fashion. In seventh ST, ESC four ROWs below. In eight ST, ESC three ROWs below. In ninth ST, ESC two ROWs below. In tenth ST, ESC one ROW below.

For subsequent triangles, first SC in next ST (traditional placement). Second ESC in next ST, one ROW below. Continue following the first triangle's pattern across the row. At the end, SC in last ST. CH 1, turn.

Make 5 ROWs of SC STs. Fasten off blue yarn after last ROW and turn work.

RPT EXTENDED ROW followed by 5 ROWs of SC until desired height, ending with an EXTENDED ROW, followed by 1 or 2 ROWs of SC. Fasten off and weave in ends.
