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Ice Cream Cone Stitch (Crochet)

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The crochet ice cream cone stitch pattern is a cute design made of single and double crochet stitches that you can use in small areas of your work, as well as throughout an entire blanket. Instructions:

With white yarn, CH 24 (mult 3).

ROW 1: SC in second CH from hook and in each CH across.

ROWs 2-5: CH 1, turn. SC in each ST across. After ROW 5, fasten off white yarn. DO NOT turn work.

With brown yarn, place a slip knot on hook. Work in same direction as ROW 5. ROW 6: SC in first ST. In 3 ROWs below, make 3 elongated DC STs in the third ST. RPT [Skip 2 STs, make 3 elongated DC STs 3 ROWs below] across. At the end, SC in last ST. Fasten off brown yarn, and turn work.

With pink yarn, place a slip knot on hook.

ROW 7: SC in first ST. Over each of the 3 DC cone STs, use the following pattern [SLST in first ST, CH 2, SLST in second ST, CH 2, SLST in third ST]. At the end, SC in last ST. CH 4, turn work.

ROW 8: Work in the top of the second brown DC ST for this ROW. See video for exact placement. RPT [7 DC cluster in cone, CH 2] across. At the end, replace the CH-2 with a CH-1 and DC in last ST. Fasten off pink yarn.

At this point the stitch pattern can be used as a border edging. If you prefer to continue on as a full piece, use the following instructions:

With white yarn, place a slip knot on hook.

NEW ROW 1: 2 SC in CH-1/DC space. Across row, make 3 DC in each space, including last space. This total number of SCs should equal the number of SCs from original ROW 1.

RPT ROWs 2-8 for second set of ice cream cones. For additional sets, use NEW ROW 1 along with original ROW 2-8 for pattern. Fasten off all yarn and weave in all ends once completed.
