



Popcorn Flower (Crochet)

This crochet popcorn flower is an easy design that you can make with either one layer of puffy petals or two layers. Terminology:

CH = Chain

DC = Double Crochet

RPT = Repeat

SC = Single Crochet

SLST = Slip Stitch

SP = Space

ST = Stitch

POPCORN = Make 5 DC in the same SP, remove hook, insert hook into top of first DC, insert hook into loop, pull loop through first ST. CH 1 rather tightly to hold stitches together.

Size/Gauge:

3" in diameter. Gauge is not important.

Materials:

30 yds worsted weight yarn. Sample used Yarn Bee Mini Maker. Size G (4 mm or 4.25 mm) crochet hook. Yarn sewing needle, scissors.

Instructions:

With white yarn, CH 2 (feel free to substitute with a magic ring).

RND 1: In 2nd CH from hook, make 8 SCs. SLST to first ST. Fasten off white yarn.

RND 2: Place slipknot on hook with light pink yarn and SLST to any SC from previous RND. CH 3 (counts as the first DC of the POPCORN). Continue with making 4 more DCs (for a total of 5 DCs), then follow remaining instructions to complete one POPCORN. CH 2. RPT [POPCORN, CH 2] in each SC around. Total = 8 POPCORN STs with CH-2 SPs in between. SLST to top of first POPCORN. Fasten off light pink yarn.

RND 3: Place slipknot on hook with medium pink yarn and SLST to any CH-2 SP from previous RND. CH 3 (counts as the first DC of the POPCORN). Continue with making 4 more DCs (for a total of 5 DCs), then follow remaining instructions to complete one POPCORN. CH 1. RPT [POPCORN, CH 1 on top of previous POPCORN. POPCORN, CH 1, in next CH-2 SP] around, ending with a POPCORN, CH 1 on top of previous POPCORN. Total = 16 POPCORN STs with CH-1 SPs in between. SLST to top of first POPCORN. Fasten off dark pink yarn.
