# Size/Gauge:

Sample shows an average 7-9 shoe size for women. Other sizes are easy to accommodate. Gauge =  $14 \text{ STs } \times 13 \text{ ROWs} = 4^{\circ} \text{ SQ in SC}$ .

#### **Materials:**

250 yds worsted weight yarn. Sample used Impeccable in Almond. Size H 5 mm crochet hook. Sewing needle. Scissors. Measuring tape. Two 1-inch buttons.

#### **Instructions:**

MAKE 2

CH 31 (or any multiple to create a 9" width)

ROW 1: SC in 2<sup>nd</sup> CH from hook. SC in each CH across. CH 1, turn.

ROW 2-28: SC in each ST across. CH 1, turn.

Measure work again to ensure about a 9" width and between an 8.5"-9.5" in height (of the total rows). Add or subtract ROWs as needed.

LAST ROW: SC in each ST across. Either leave a long tail end for sewing the back heel seam, or fasten off and weave in ends. Use another strand for sewing.

### HEEL:

Fold the rectangle in half, with the right side of the SCs meeting the left side of the SCs of the same ROWs. Stitch the back heel section together. Fasten off and weave in ends. Turn inside out if that side looks better.

## TOE:

Divide the top edge of the toe section in three. For example, 30 stitches means 10 STs, 10 STs, 10 STs.

For the RIGHT SLIPPER, 10 stitches on the left will remain unworked (or one-third if you altered the starting chain), while 20 stitches (two-thirds) towards the right will be sewn and cinched together in a circle. The flap can then be pulled towards the right and sewn either along its entire edge or tacked at its point. Sew on a decorative button if desired. Weave in all ends.

For the LEFT SLIPPER, 10 stitches on the right will remain unworked, while 20 stitches towards the left will be sewn and cinched. Follow the remaining instructions as for the RIGHT SLIPPER.
