Terminology:

CH = Chain

DC = Double Crochet

RPT = Repeat

SP = Space

ST = Stitch

Instructions:

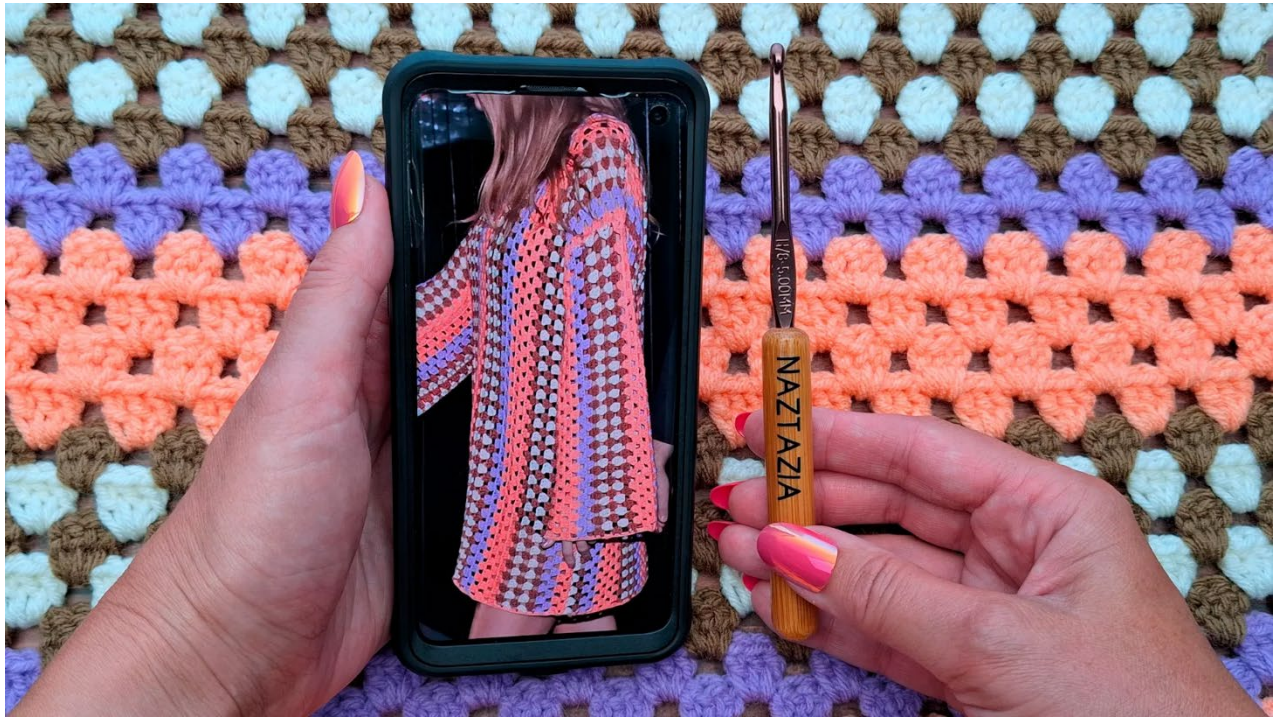
CH 24 (multiple of 4)

ROW 1: 2 DC in 4th CH from hook. RPT [CH 1, Skip 3 CHs, 3 DC in next CH] across. CH 4, turn.

ROW 2: RPT [In the next SP, 3 DC, CH 1]. At the end, DC in the top of the previous ROW's turning CH-3. CH 3, turn.

ROW 3: 2 DC in SP. RPT [CH 1, 3 DC in next SP] across. CH 4, turn.

RPT ROWs 2 & 3.



Tips for making the dress:

- 1) Use Sport weight yarn or DK weight yarn for clothing. Or even Crochet Thread Size 3. Worsted weight yarn is good for blankets, along with heavier scarves and shawls. The celebrity dress is 100% acrylic.
- 2) Make two rectangles, one for the back and one for the front.
- 3) When starting the initial chain, that chain will form the height of the dress, from the neck to the legs. Perhaps something like 100 or 120 chains will work with certain yarn.
- 4) The number of rows determines the width of the dress. Make more rows for a wider dress, less rows for a smaller dress.
- 5) A straight neckline is fine for both the front and back of the dress. However, the celebrity dress contains a tapered neckline with more stitches around the shoulder area.
- 6) The sleeves are two rectangles as well. The initial chain determines the sleeve length from the shoulder to the wrist. The number of rows determines the circumference of the sleeve around the arms.
- 7) Sew the back, front, and two sleeves together. Then crochet a single crochet border around all visible edges.
- 8) The step-by-step tutorial video shows this in detail.
